

Why use a barcode?



- Each barcode represents a specific trap or location, allowing Biosecurity Blitz reports to be accurately linked to where the observation was made.
- Scanning a barcode is faster and more accurate than manually entering a trap ID or location each time a report is made.
- Using a barcode reduces the risk of human error, ensuring consistent and reliable data for pest surveillance. Barcodes help researchers and biosecurity teams monitor changes in pest activity at specific sites over time (e.g. repeat sampling or measurements).
- The barcode makes it easier for multiple users to report from the same trap without confusion.
